

LITTLE BLACK CADDIS

HOOK: 1x Short #14 (Dai Riki 305)

THREAD: Black 8/0

RIB: Red Wire Small

UNDER WING: Pearl Krystal flash

HACKLE: Brown Saddle

WING: Bleached Elk Hair

Tying Steps:

1. Pinch the barb flat and mount the hook in the vise.
2. Dress the hook from one eye length back to the hook bend.
3. Tie on the Red Wire. Spin your bobbin counterclockwise to make the thread flat. Build a slim flat body to one eye length behind the hook eye.
4. Rib the body (open turns) with the Red Wire. Tie the wire off and remove the excess.
5. Tie the Krystal Flash to form the underwing, (12-14 pieces) to each side two eye lengths back from the hook eye. Trim the underwing to the body length.
6. Strip a few barbules from the hackle stem and tie the hackle to the hook shank. Take two to three turns of hackle to make the wing. Tie the hackle off and remove the excess.
7. Cut a dozen or so hairs of Bleached Elk Hair. Clean and stack the hair. Tie in behind the hook eye (Elk Hair Caddis style) with a few wraps behind the hair to stand it up. Whip finish and add a drop of head cement.
8. **GO FISHING!**



Knots to Know

KRYSTON LOOP KNOT

Kryston knot is a loop knot used on nymphs, wet flies and streamers. It is a simple knot to tie and holds strong. The loop allows the fly to move around and dance and look more alive.

fishing. It's a worthwhile project to get involved with as some of our members, including myself have done. Check them out: <https://themayflyproject.com>.

The guest speaker for the Jan. 15 meeting will be Idaho Department of Fish and Game fisheries biologist Rob Ryan, who will address westslope cutthroat trout restoration in Binarch Creek and the Priest River drainage. He will share his observations from surveys of Priest River tributaries and from the implementation of the rotenone project to remove brook trout.

He also will cover his role in implementing fisheries-related mitigation through the Clark Fork Settlement Agreement.

Lastly, I would like to share a review of a fly rod I purchased from Dave Calhoun, of Blanchard, Idaho-based **NW Rods**, who was our featured speaker in April.

I purchased a 10-foot. (actually 10.8-foot, in two 65-inch" sections) 4/5-weight, two-piece, single-hand rod and was looking for the right time and place to test it on

the water. I spent most of last summer dedicated to Trout Spey and when in the boat stuck to my usual lighter 4-weight sticks.

My buddy and club member Gary "The-Guide" McDannel and I were planning a trip to the Clearwater in November to fish and stay for a few days – unfortunately the same time the big rains and melt-off came. With that huge runoff taking place, Gary suggested we head over to the Missouri River in Montana, thinking the a tailwater river should be a lot more controlled – and that it was, however it was windy.

We did use a guide, mostly to avoid towing one

of our own boats, and we let him do all the rowing (in the wind), thus allowing us 100% fishing time. The Guide commented that he really liked fishing with us because he didn't have to say "mend" once.

The new 4/5-weight rod had some good backbone that allowed it to punch through the wind well, and the front section was still nimble enough to detect the slightest take from very picky fish, using a Chernobyl and short dropper with a midge emerger.

Having the 10-foot length sure helped with the mends in the wind.

The rod is good looking; the cork handle is top quality

and feels great, especially in the wind.


The action of the rod was pleasing and responsive, hooking into those nice size rainbows and brown trout and letting them run and tug until tired.

If you're looking for nice 4/5-weight, 10-foot rod that's quality-built and moderately priced and cuts through wind like a Samari sword, think about giving Dave Calhoun a call and see what he can outfit you with.




